Acquire a copy of Ta-nehisi Coates' *Between the World and Me*. As you read *Between the World and Me*, annotate your book and answer the following questions:

Speaker—do not look this up anywhere. Use the book itself to answer the questions.

- 1. What does Coates reveal about his upbringing?
- 2. His education?
- 3. His profession?

Occasion—

- 1. When did Coates write this book?
- 2. What events inspired Coates' writing?

Audience—

- 1. Whom does Coates address?
- 2. AFTER you have read the book, find a review of the book online, print it out, and annotate it as follows:
 - a. Annotate statements you agree with by putting a check in the margin.
 - b. Annotate statements you disagree with by putting an X in the margin
 - c. Annotate statements that puzzle you by putting a question mark in the margin.

Structure—

- 1. What repetition do you notice?
- 2. What is the source of Coates' title?
- 3. How is the book divided? What is the main idea of each part?
- 4. After you have finished the book, go back and read the opening sentence. Then reread the last sentence. Speculate on why Coates chose to open and end this way.

- 1. What do you believe is Coates' most important idea?
- 2. What anecdote do you find to be the most compelling/moving/disturbing?
