WHAT WE WILL BE COVERING IN THIS CLASS:

This class is an introduction to the amazing machines we call computers, how they work, and how you can use them as a tool for a vast variety of purposes. We will be focusing on the programming language Javascript in this class, but will also be taking a look at the markup language HTML and some other more general computer science concepts. The topics we will cover include Digital Info, App Design, Variables, Conditionals, Loops, Functions, Algorithms, Libraries, Website Design, Cybersecurity, Basic Robotics and more! There are no textbook requirements for this class, just an open mind and a willingness to learn. All topics covered will be posted in our Google Classroom for you to revisit whenever you wish.

HOW TO ACCUMULATE POINTS:

Your grade in this class is not based on categories like tests and homework, but rather on how many total points you accumulate in the class. Points are based on the amount of work that is required to complete an assignment; for example, a warm up activity will be worth much less than a two-week-long project. You will always be told how many points each assignment is worth and provided with grading rubrics when applicable.
