Course Objectives



The objectives of this course are for students to develop leadership and study skills. These include but are not limited to how to maintain a positive attitude, time management strategies, communication skills, professional development and to learn about options available to them after high school in the areas of education and careers. Course Topics



Self-Development

Students will learn strategies that will help them grow and develop both individually, and in working with partners and groups. This includes study skills, computer skills, working as a group, exploring various career fields, and self-reflection



Social Responsibility

Students will work with younger students in the community to serve as positive role models. They will complete several community service activities, such as mentoring students on how to deal with bullies, on steam projects, helping the elderly and disabled, and in drug and alcohol prevention.

Attendance Policy



Students are required to attend class every day from 3:27 pm to 4:22 pm. Students not in class will be marked absent. Any student who is not IN THEIR SEAT when the bell rings will be marked tardy. Tardies result in loss of points. Students who have detention but come afterwards will be marked tardy and lose points. Students are dismissed by the teacher, not the bell.
