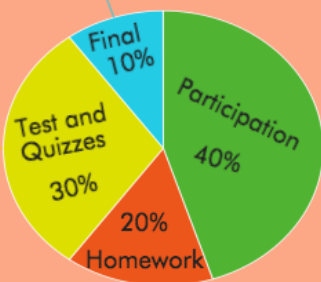
We all learn differently. Students are expected to repeat vocabulary words and sign them in order to increase comprehension, and to acquire the words faster.
