Course State Standards:

- Students demonstrate knowledge of and competency in motor skills, movement patterns, and strategies needed to perform a variety of physical activities.
- Students achieve a level of physical fitness for health and performance while demonstrating knowledge of fitness concepts, principles, and strategies.
- Students demonstrate knowledge of psychological and sociological concepts, principles, and strategies that apply to the learning and performance of physical activity.

PXS001, Criminal Justice PE Grade 9-12

This course is designed for cadets in the criminal justice program. The class is pure with cadets only and expectations are higher than the standard physical education class. The students will engage in activities to enhance fitness in a manner that will prepare him/her for a physically demanding field of work and will instill a desire to maintain a high level of fitness throughout his/her career. In addition to fitness, Pride, Professionalism, Respect, and Teamwork will be a guideline for the class.

Locker & Locker room rules: Students may use a locker in the locker room AT THEIR OWN RISK, during their PE period ONLY. They are not to share their locker combination with anyone else and should check their locks before leaving the locker room. All students' possessions should be locked in a locker. VALUABLES SHOULD NOT BE BROUGHT TO CLASS. Students inside the locker room, other than during their PE class, will receive a referral for further disciplinary action.

Cell phones & Electronic Devices: When students enter the locker room, all cell phones and electronic devices should remain in a backpack or locker until the end of the period. Cell phones and electronic devices are not allowed during class. Students may choose to lock their cell phones in their school lockers rather than the locker room but they must do so during the passing period. Cell phones/listening devices will be confiscated if they are out during class (see school cell phone policy).

Uniform:

Students must wear a plain white shirt and dark (navy blue/black) athletic shorts for the first month of school. The shorts must have a 4"-8" inseam and loose, like basketball or soccer shorts. Thereafter, a uniform will be provided to them and no substitute clothing is accepted. Extra or replacement shirt or shorts are \$10 and \$15 respectively. Sweats are optional and for an extra cost. \$25 each or \$45 for both hoodie and sweatpants. While in uniform, no jewelry is accepted. If it's religious, it must be hidden under the shirt or sweatband. If it's visible or puts another cadet at risk for safety, the student will lose points. PE clothing may be purchased through the PE Dept. with cash only. Lost or stolen clothes must be replaced by the student within two days. If a hat must be worn outdoors, it must be the SPD blue baseball cap that can be purchased from myself of the magnet officer.

must be in the Health Fitness Zone (HFZ) in 5 of 6 areas tested during the Spring test or they must continue taking physical education classes each year until they pass regardless of their PE grade. Though students will have opportunities to improve their fitness during class, students who struggle in specific areas are strongly encouraged to work on those areas outside of class. Standard Grading:

Each student is expected to login to their Infinite Campus using their username (firstname-lastname@student.scusd.edu) and password (please see your counselor ASAP if you don't know your password). Here they can see their grades, class information and online assignments. Some assignments will be directly submitted through Infinite Campus. If the student does not have access to their account, they need to inform their teacher immediately.

Assessment (20%):

In class and online assignments will be posted on Infinite Campus to check for student understanding and/or develop further understanding of various concepts related to Physical Education. To ensure accountability for student learning, assessments on safety, form, fitness, and basic anatomy will take place throughout the semester. Participation (80%):

Students are expected to come prepared with the required uniform and participate in all activities on a regular basis. Students will receive 10 points per day. Standing around, horseplay and activities other than what is assigned are off task behaviors that will result in a loss of points. Students who are not dressed will lose all points for the day unless they have appropriate footwear and participate for the entire period. Any off task behavior by a non-dressed student will result in a zero for the day. Points may be deducted for the following reasons:

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| Tardy | -2 |
| Off task behavior (each occurrence) | -2 |
| Students MUST participate if partial or non-dressed. Must have tennis shoes. | -4 |
| Improper shoes | -10 |
| Cell phone or electronic device in class | -10 |
| Absent (See Make-up Work section below) | -10 |

Athletes:

All athletes are required to dress and participate in PE class on game days. Athletes will not be dismissed until the posted dismissal time and not be allowed in locker rooms until after dismissal time.

Medical Excuses:

A parent or guardian may excuse a student from participation in PE for 1-3 days by writing a note to the teacher explaining the reason for the excuse, the number of days to be excused and a time/number to call for verification. **EXCUSES LONGER THAN 3 DAYS REQUIRE A DOCTOR'S NOTE. PARENTS MAY NOT EXCUSE STUDENTS FROM DRESSING FOR PE.** See Make-up Work section below.

Make-up Work:

One make-up assignment is required for each excused absence or each excused non-participation day. Make-up work is due within **Five** days of a return from absence or end of excuse. Students may make-up no more than **Ten** days per quarter. If there is a medical situation that will require missing more than ten days, students are advised to talk to their counselors about other options. Off campus school related activities including athletics are excused from make-up work assignments. **NON-SUITES AND UNEXCUSED ABSENCES CANNOT BE MADE UP**

Transfers:

Students who transfer into PE more than 20 days after the beginning of a semester will not receive a passing grade unless they arrive with a transfer grade from their previous teacher/school, or they make arrangements with their teacher to do make-up assignments.
