

ELD Support- Level 1 - Syllabus 2024-2025

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The main goal of this course is to *help* you. You are a brave student for coming to school in a new country and for wanting to learn English. This class will help support your English Language Development (ELD). We will use a variety of activities to help you learn more English skills (as described in the <u>California English Language Development Standards</u>.) Also, we will practice English to help you prepare for the ELPAC test (English Language Proficiency Assessments for California). We will use a variety of different tools and curriculum, including SCUSD's adopted National Geographic "Inside The USA" and "Welcome Newcomers" curriculum. We will also play games to practice English and support you with your work from other classrooms. In addition, this will be a safe space where you can come for emotional and academic support. That is why this class is called "ELD Support." We know it can be hard being in a new school and not feeling comfortable with English. But in this class, everyone is like you - new to this country and new to this school.

Every week we will have:

-support time to help you with your work from other classes or any other needs you might have. -time where we will play games with each other or on the computer to practice English and get to know each other.

-time where we will practice reading, writing and speaking in English - especially in preparation for the ELPAC exam you will take every year.

EXPECTATIONS AND GOALS: In this course, you will practice your English skills with a supportive teacher and peers. You will need to participate and communicate in order to create this positive learning community. We will work hard to support you in your other classes where you might run into challenges. You should feel free to speak your home language while being willing to practice your English skills. BUT, it is very important you take this class seriously - you are being graded!

- A school laptop: We will help you learn how to use it. You need to bring it everyday.
- Earphones: only if you have them, I have some in class
- A backpack for your laptop and other materials
- If you have it, a cell phone! It can help with translation. Pen or pencil
- Notebook or binder paper to write on and folder or binder for your different classes
