4. GENERAL OVERVIEW

Course Description: The AP French Language and Culture course is designed as a culmination of students' French studies in High School. In AP French 4 students review and refine the structures necessary to communicate in French while developing skills across the three communicative modes: Interpersonal, Interpretive, and Presentational using a wide range of authentic materials. AP French 4 emphasizes all aspects of language: listening, speaking, reading, writing, and culture. This course is designed to prepare students for the AP French Language and Culture exam. This course is conducted in French and students are expected to speak French almost exclusively.

5. COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Provide opportunities for students to demonstrate their ability in Interpersonal, Interpretive and Presentational Communication from a variety of authentic audio, visual, audiovisual, written and print sources
- Provide opportunities for students to demonstrate an understanding of the literature and culture of Francophone world.
- Provide opportunities for students to become highly proficient in Reading, Writing, Listening, and Speaking French.

AP EXAM

For each of the 6 Units students will:

1. READ print and LISTEN to audio sources and answer multiple choice questions.
2. VIEW Visual Sources (films, shorts, commercials etc.) and discuss and write about.
3. READ literature, Articles, Advertisements etc. and answer short essay questions.
4. LISTEN to AUDIO ONLY sources (Podcasts, Radio Broadcasts, and Interviews etc.) and will answer questions and discuss.
5. WRITE emails, persuasive essays and expository essays.
6. SPEAK (Via: directed conversations, thematic presentations, cultural comparisons, and discussions)
7. GRAMMAR REVIEW and VOCABULARY

COURSE REQUIREMENTS, ATTENDANCE AND SPECIFIC GRADING POLICY

3. Speak up & **speak French** as frequently as possible, with the teacher and your classmates.

HOMEWORK: Homework will be assigned as needed: readings, translations, grammar exercises, cultural presentations etc. **Homework will be checked for completeness and points at the beginning of each day.**
