Tutoring:

After school tutoring will be offered every Wednesday from 3:20-4:30pm in C308 and at lunch by appointment.

Late Homework/Missed Tests & Quizzes Policy:

Homework will be collected on Fridayof each week and on the day of the unit test for remaining unit assignments, but will be expected to be completed on the day it is assigned in order to avoid falling behind. Students will have opportunities to ask questions on each given assignment in the beginning of class on the day after it is assigned. Late assignments may be turned in by the day of the unit test for any given unit, but will only be worth half credit. Keep in mind, the class website will list all assignments, as well as dates for tests/quizzes. Therefore, students are encouraged to keep up with homework even during absences, as the workload can pile up quickly at this level.

If a student misses a test or quiz as a result of an excused absence, the student should arrange to make up that test or quiz the day they return from the absence.

Absences resulting from school activities, athletics, or previously scheduled appointments/vacations are different in that all work that will be missed should be discussed with the teacher <u>before</u> the absence so that the student does not fall behind unnecessarily. When possible, tests/quizzes that will be missed during this type of absence should be taken ahead of time. If a student does not check if any work or assessment needs to be completed <u>before</u> this type of absence it may result in losing credit.

Note outlines for each unit will be posted on the class website, in addition to mandatory video lessons. When present in class, students are encouraged to use a print out of the note outline to minimize note-taking in class. Note-taking is part of the class grade and therefore is mandatory whether utilizing the outline or not. If a student is absent they must print out the note outline and fill out the examples by copying another student's notes, coming in to copy the teacher's notes, or using the textbook examples to complete the example problems on their own.

Cheating Policy:

All instances of cheating including copying homework, letting another student copy homework, taking answers from another student's test/quiz, talking or passing notes during a test/quiz, using unapproved cheat sheets of any kind, etc. will result in a score of 0 and parent contact.

Extra Credit Policy:

Extra credit will be offered rarely and will not exceed 2% of the assignment portion of the grade.

Redemption Test Policy:

Following each unit test students will be offered the opportunity to earn up to 25% of the unit test value through a redemption test (not to exceed a total test score of 100%). This redemption test will be taken outside of class and requires the student bring in test corrections (in brightly colored pen) attached to the original test. A practice assignment may also be required to be eligible for redemption points. The redemption test will consist of questions related to the most commonly missed test questions.
